

CARMEN

Cards

Deal six cards to each player. Place the remaining cards in a draw pile, face down. Flip one card over to start a discard pile. The youngest player goes first. Play continues clockwise. In each turn, try to play a card from your hand on top of the discard pile.

Location Card: Play a Location Card by matching any detail in one of the three categories: continent, population, and primary language(s) spoken.

Wild Card: Play Carmen's Wild Card on top of any other card. Once you play a Wild Card, you can then immediately play any location card from your hand.

VILE Card: This card can be played on top of any Location Card. This skips the next player's turn.

ACME Card: The next player must draw two cards from the pile. Then it's his/her turn.

If none of the cards in your hand can be played, draw one card from the draw pile. The first player to run out of cards wins!

Remove the Wild Cards, VILE Cards, and ACME Cards. Deal six cards to each player, and place the rest of the deck face down. Flip one card over to start the discard pile. Your goal is to be the first player to have one Location Card from each of the six continents in the game. On each turn, you may pick up either the top card from the draw pile or the top card from the discard pile. Then you must place one card in the discard pile so your hand always contains six cards. The first player to collect all six continents wins.

Match Master

Remove the Wild Cards, VILE Cards, and ACME Cards. Then spread the cards out face down. Each player should choose 5 cards to start. For each turn, ask the opposite player for a card that matches a card in your hand based on the location information. For instance, you might ask, "Do you have any capitals in Asia?" If the other player has a match, you put your matching pair down face-up in front of you. If the other player does not have a match, you pick a card from the pile. The first player to match all the cards in his or her hand wins.
